What is wireless?

- Wireless Internet access uses radio frequency signals to exchange information between your computer and the Internet.
- No cables are required.

How do I use wireless at the Library?

- You will need to bring your laptop or hand-held device to the Library.
- Your laptop must be wireless enabled and have a wireless network card installed in it.
- Most wireless equipment will be compatible; however, the Library will not guarantee the compatibility of your equipment and the library's network.
- Staff cannot help you set up and configure your laptop for use with the wireless network. Staff has prepared basic instructions for accessing the wireless network. These are available at the Reference Desk or on the Library web page: www.wtmlib.info.
- Printers are not part of the wireless network. If you wish to print, save your work to a floppy and print from one of the public computers.

Will I need any special settings or passwords to connect?

- The library's network is open to all visitors.
- No special encryption settings, user names or passwords are required.
- The Library is not responsible for any changes you make to your computer's settings.
- If you need additional assistance, you may have to contact the manufacturer of your hardware or software.
